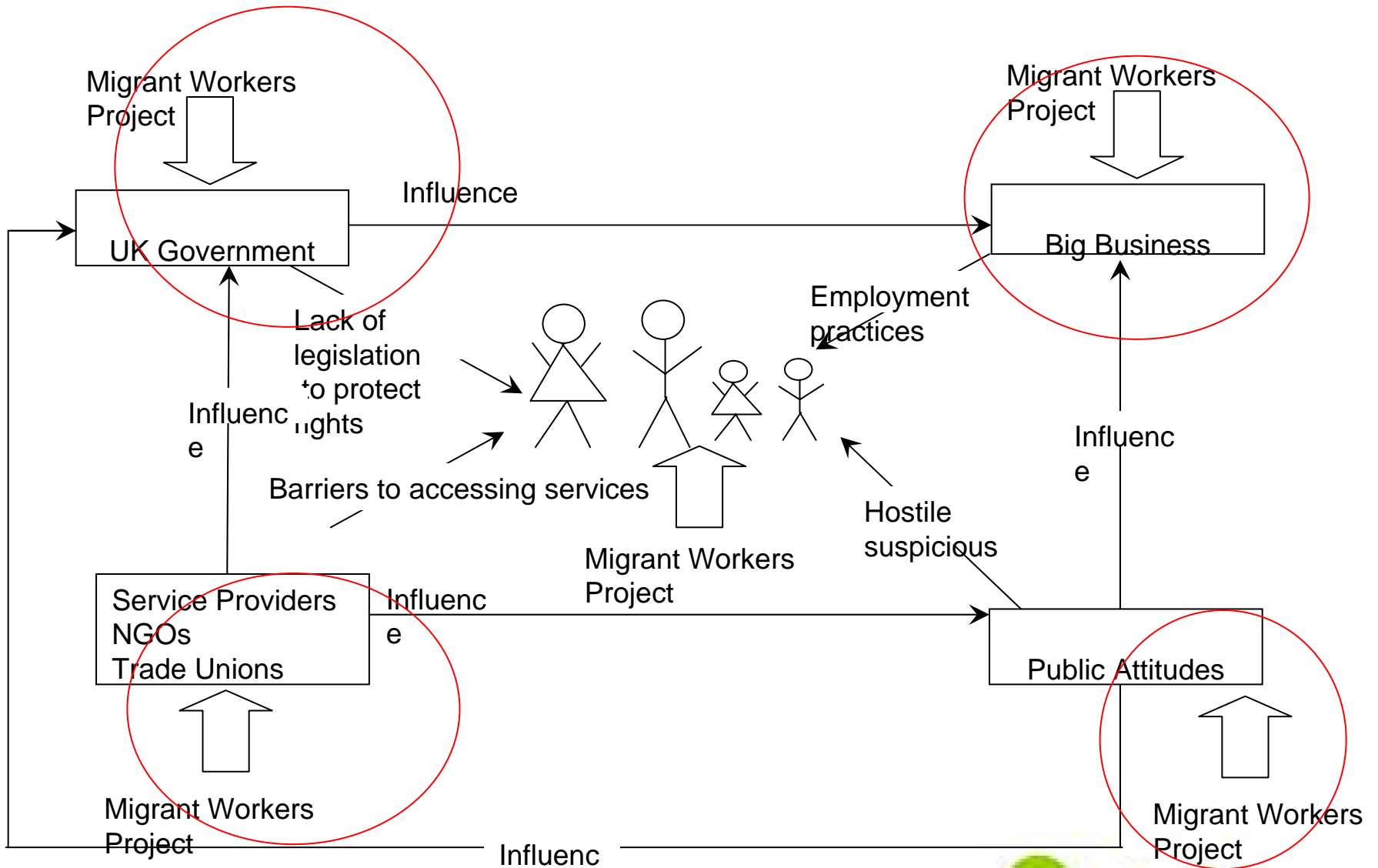


Oxfam's work in the UK

- Work with migrant workers from a range of nationalities and circumstances
- 25 different workshops on themes identified by migrant workers themselves.
- Most popular workshops ‘ Knowing Your Rights at Work’ , ‘ Housing Rights’ , ‘Welfare Rights’ and ‘ Adult Education’
- Workshops have been delivered in community centres, a church, English language support groups and ESOL classes in Salford and Manchester
- 19 different agencies have been involved in the delivery of workshops
- 10 different migrant worker ‘ leaders’ received training and support to build their capacity to support their own communities
